



Generic Double-Knit Can Cozy

SIZE

One

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Circumference: 8.5 inches

Height: 4 inches

GAUGE

28 sts/44 rows = 4 inches in stockinette stitch

MATERIALS

2 colors (min.) of fingering weight yarn (Approx. 45 yards each)

1 set US # 2/2.75mm double-point needles

1 tapestry needle for finishing

1 12 ounce beverage can for blocking

WHITE AND BLACK COZY

Knit Picks Palette [100% Peruvian Wool; 231yd/211m per 50g skein]; color: White; 1 skein

Knit Picks Palette [100% Peruvian Wool; 231yd/211m per 50g skein]; color: Black; 1 skein

Note: Approx 45yd/41m of each yarn is needed for one cozy.

YELLOW AND BLACK COZY

Knit Picks Palette [100% Peruvian Wool; 231yd/211m per 50g skein]; color: Semolina; 1 skein

Knit Picks Palette [100% Peruvian Wool; 231yd/211m per 50g skein]; color: Black; 1 skein

Note: Approx 45yd/41m of each yarn is needed for one cozy.

WHITE AND BLUE COZY

Knit Picks Palette [100% Peruvian Wool; 231yd/211m per 50g skein]; color: White; 1 skein

Knit Picks Palette [100% Peruvian Wool; 231yd/211m per 50g skein]; color: Blue; 1 skein

Knit Picks Palette [100% Peruvian Wool; 231yd/211m per 50g skein]; color: Pool; 1 skein

Note: Approx 45yd/41m of White and Blue (each) and 3yd/3m of Pool is needed for one cozy.

PATTERN NOTES

Knit in the round, starting from the top of the work, using double knit stockinette and reverse stockinette stitches to form the cylinder. End with double knit stockinette and decrease stitches to create the bottom of the work.

Outside of the cozy is the RS and inside of the cozy is the WS. Continuously work from the inside with WS as front, facing you.

The first four stitches knit on each needle should be pulled tight to avoid gaps.

White and Black Cozy

MC (main color) white yarn

CC (contrasting color) black yarn

Yellow and Black Cozy

MC (main color) semolina yarn

CC (contrasting color) black yarn

White and Blue Cozy

MC (main Color) white yarn

CC (contrasting Color) blue yarn

SCC (secondary contrasting color) pool yarn

Adding CC stitches on 1st Round

Keep strands separate – MC in back of working needle and CC in front of working needle constantly for the entire round.

MCKb & CCpf knit into back of stitch with MC and purl into front of stitch with CC

Reverse Stockinette Stitches

Keep strands separate – MC in back of working needle and CC in front of working needle constantly for the entire round.

MCKb keep MC strand in back, knit MC

CCpf keep CC strand in front, purl CC

Stockinette Stitches

Move strands together front or back, before each stitch, as directed.

MCp with both strands in front, purl with MC

CCK with both strands in back, knit with CC

CCp with both strands in front, purl with CC

MCK with both strands in back, knit with MC



Decreasing

With double knitting, the 4 stitches (2 MC and 2 CC) to be used in [MCp2tog with both strands in front, CCK2tog with both strands in back] must be reordered by swapping the second and third stitch. Here are two methods for doing so – the first with the use of an extra needle, the second (similar to cabling without a cable needle) without:

While reordering the stitches keep the strands together in the front or the back of the working needle but the strands will need to be in the front before MCp2tog.

1. Slip 1st MC stitch to RH (right hand) needle.
 Slip 1st CC stitch to extra needle, keeping in front of work.
 Slip 2nd MC stitch to RH needle.
 Return 1st CC stitch to LH (left hand) needle.
 Return 2 MC stitches to LH needle.

2. Slip 1st MC stitch, then 1st CC stitch, then 2nd MC stitch to RH needle
 With tip LH needle, pick up front loop of 1st CC stitch inserting LH needle into front loop from left to right
 Pinch the left most MC stitch (2nd MC stitch) with your left hand from the back, slip the RH needle out of the left and middle stitches (2nd MC stitch and 1st CC stitch), and scoop the left-most MC stitch onto the right needle again, as if to purl. (You now have the 1st and 2nd CC stitches side by side on the LH needle and the 1st and 2nd MC stitches on the RH needle.)
 Return 2 MC stitches to LH needle.

PATTERN

Using long tail cast on method, loosely C0 48 sts with MC; Distribute evenly to 3 needles

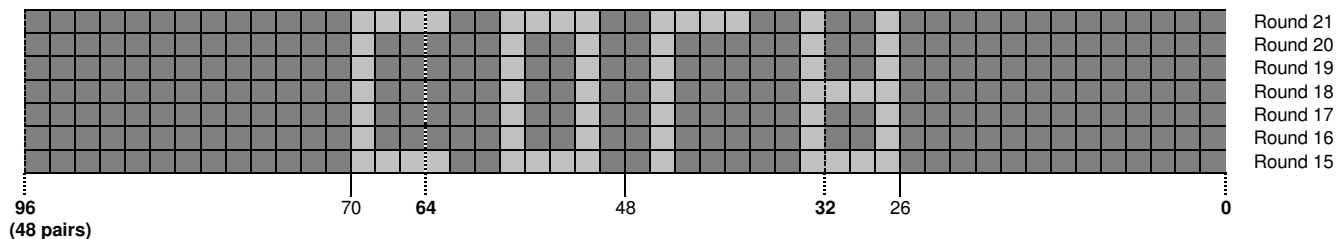
Round 1: Join to knit in the round. WS in front, [MCkb & CCpf] to end. This will add 1 CC stitch after every MC stitch.

Rounds 2 -5 rev St st (see notes): Proceed with 32 stitches of alternating MC and CC on each needle. Keep MC strand behind the working needle and CC strand in front of the working needle. [MCkb, CCpf] to end

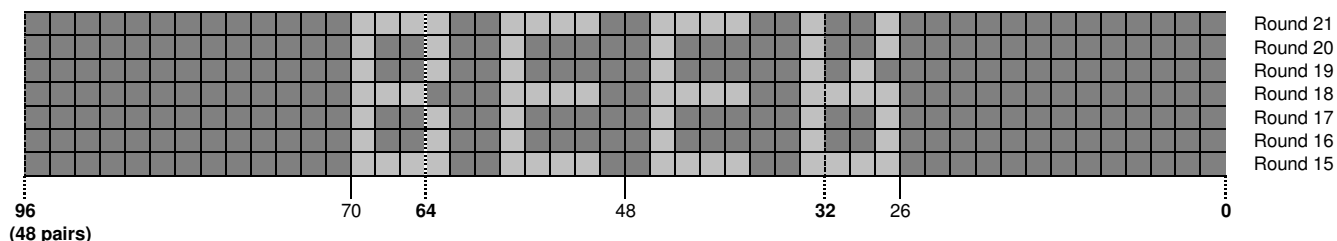
Rounds 6-14 St st (see notes): [MCp, CCK] to end

Rounds 15-40 (White and Black Cozy): Continue with the same stitches but switch strands as directed to create contrasting color letters. For rounds 15-21 follow chart below starting from the bottom. (Chart represents inside face of cozy; each square represents two stitches.) For rounds 22-40 St st (see notes): [MCp, CCK] to end

■ MCp, CCK □ CCp, MCK

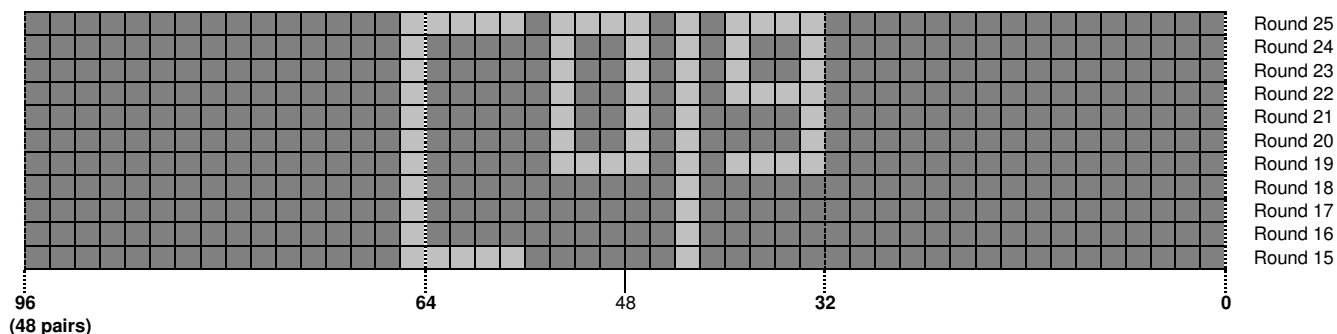


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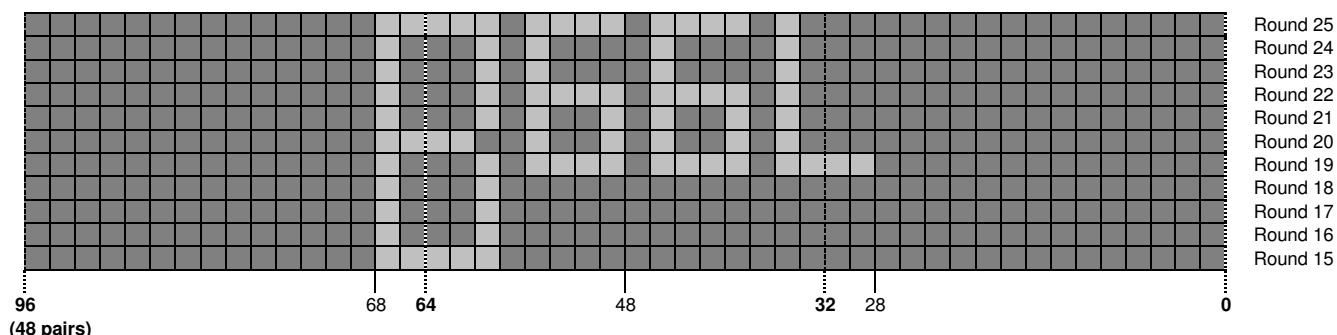


Rounds 15-40 (Yellow and Black Cozy): Continue with the same stitches but switch strands as directed to create contrasting color letters. For rounds 15-25 follow chart below starting from the bottom. (Chart represents inside face of cozy; each square represents two stitches.) For rounds 26-40 St st (see notes): [MCp, CCK] to end

■ MCp, CCK □ CCp, MCK

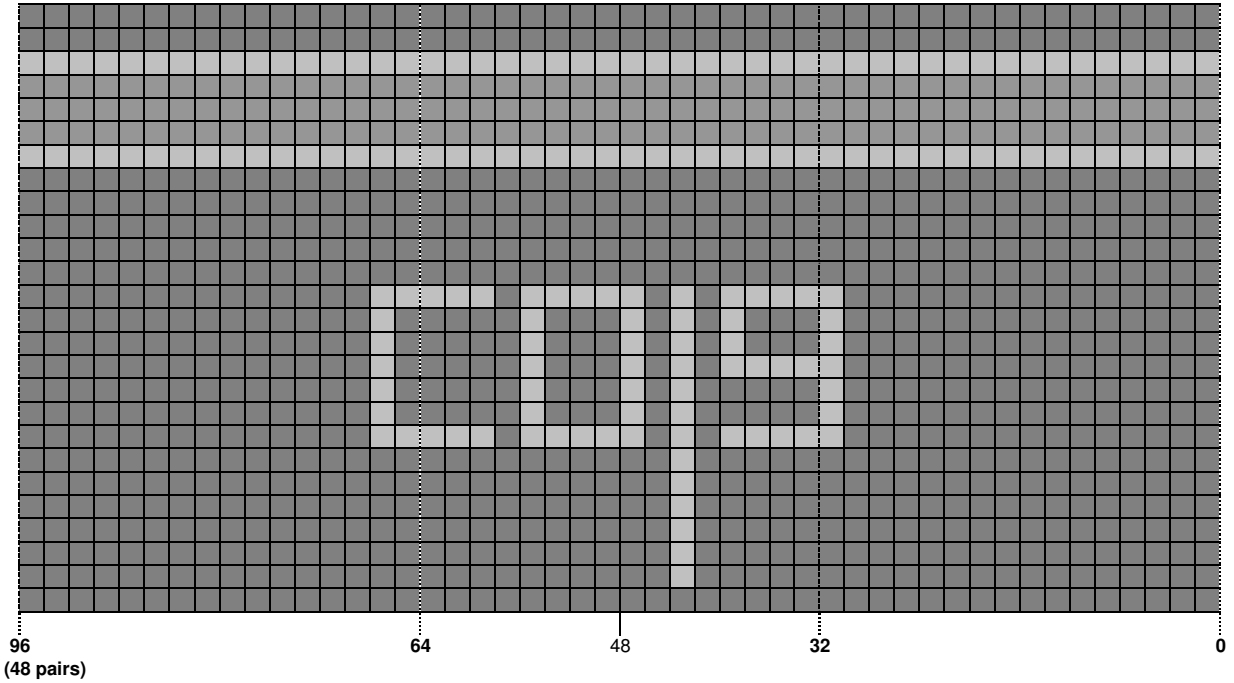

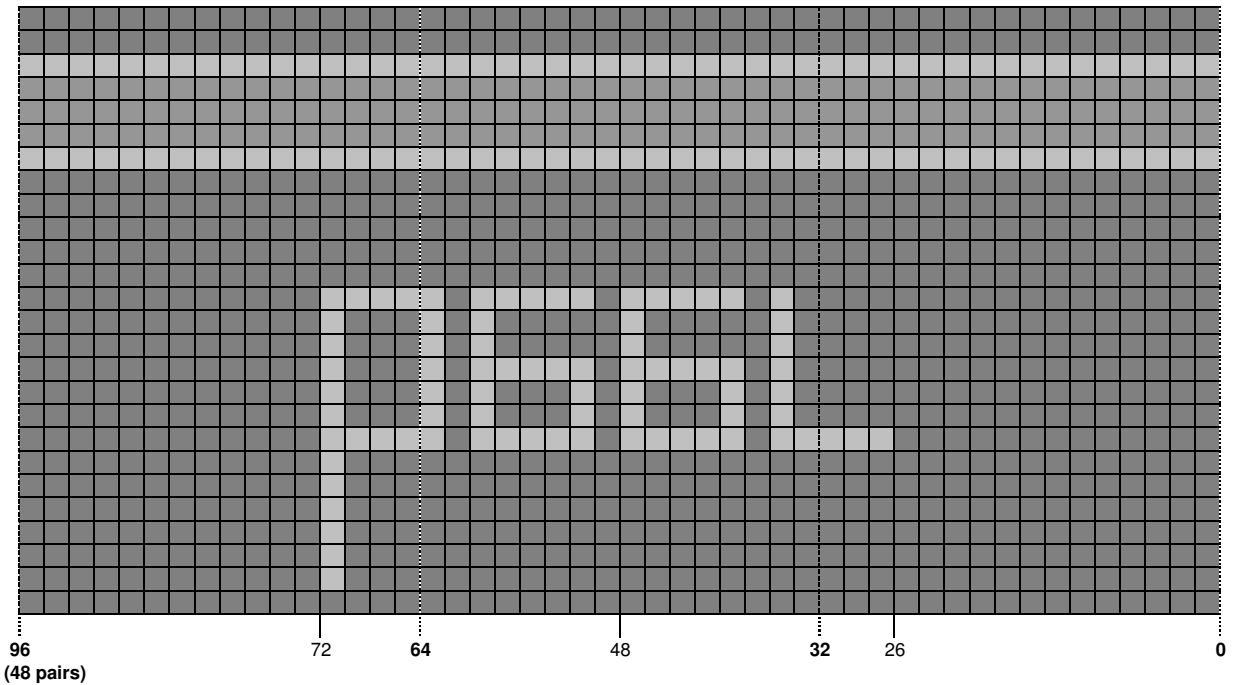
Rounds 15-40 (White and Blue Cozy): Continue with the same stitches but switch strands as directed to create contrasting color letters. For rounds 15-40 follow chart below starting from the bottom. (Chart represents inside face of cozy; each square represents two stitches.)

Rounds 41-45 rev St st (see notes): [MCkb, CCpf] to end

Rounds 46-51 St st (see notes): [MCp, CCK] to end

Round 52: Start decreasing - see notes. *[MCp, CCK] twice, p2togMC with both strands in front, k2togCC with both strands in back* to end

Round 53: [MCp, CCK] to end

Round 54: *MCp, CCK, MCp2tog with both strands in front, CCK2tog with both strands in back* to end

Round 55: [MCp, CCK] to end

Rounds 56-58: *MCp2tog with both strands in front, CCK2tog with both strands in back* to end

Separately, weave together 3 rem CC sts and 3 rem MC sts. (MC stitches should remain on the outside of the work and CC stitches should remain on the inside of the work.) Weave CC sts first and pull CC strand through to inside of work. Then weave MC stitches keeping strand on outside of work.

FINISHING

Weave in ends. Wet block on 12 oz. can. Enjoy!

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
